### WHERE WE WORK

*The provinces listed below are where our student sponsorship programs are located. You can find them on the map on the back of this page.*

**Kampot Province** is located on the coast, where fishing is the primary occupation.

**Kompong Chhnang Province** lies in flooded areas along the Tonle Sap River and in forested upland areas.

**Kompong Thom Province** is mostly forested. The eastern part of the province lies within the largest lowland evergreen forest in Southeast Asia.

**Kratie Province** lies along the Mekong River. Away from the river, the province is mostly forested.

**Oddar Meanchey Province** was the scene of the last fighting of Cambodia's civil war. The eastern part of the province was controlled by the Khmer Rouge until 1998 when their leaders were captured and others defected to the government.

**Preah Vihear Province** is one of the most remote provinces in Cambodia. It only became accessible by road from Phnom Penh in 1998, after years of being cut off by Khmer Rouge civil war activity.

**Pursat Province** stretches all the way from the Tonle Sap Lake to the border with Thailand. Most of the province is forested.

**Siem Reap Province** is where the Angkor Wat temples are located. It borders the Tonle Sap Lake.

### ORGANIZATIONS WE WORK WITH IN CAMBODIA

*The following Cambodian NGOs (non-governmental organizations) are partners with Friendship with Cambodia. They implement our Student Sponsorship Program. We also fund some of these groups to address rural poverty through micro-credit, women's programs, and natural resources protection.*

**AEC is Action for Environment and Community** working in Kompong Chhnang and Pursat Provinces. Activities include community-based forest management and helping the poorest families.

**AK is Anakot Komar (Children's Future)** working in Pursat Province. Activities include support for self-help groups, improving commune governance and community-based organizations, agricultural training, job skills training, literacy classes, care for families living with AIDS, and advocacy for children's rights and community forests.

**CCD is Community Capacities for Development** working in Kompong Chhnang Province. Activities include organizing community fisheries on the Tonle Sap Lake, facilitating community peace-building networks, helping the poorest families, and forming women's self-help groups.

**CDA is Children's Development Association** working in Oddar Meanchey Province. Activities include setting up credit programs and community-based forest management.

**DKA is Day Ku Aphiwat (Development Partners)** working in Kampot, Sihanoukville, Kompong Speu, Oddar Meanchey, and Siem Reap Provinces. Activities include organizing women's networks and building their capacity, helping the poorest women form self-help groups, organizing youth, community organizing and development, and natural resources management.

**EHE is Environmental and Health Education** working in Kompong Thom Province. Activities include human resources development, natural resources management, community organizing, and economic development.

**OPKC is Organization to Promote Kui Culture** working in Kompong Thom and Preah Vihear Provinces. Activities include helping the poorest families and registering indigenous communities' communal land.
